# A PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR'S STORY

I am a civilian survivor of the attack on Pearl Harbor. I was 2 ½ years old at the time of the attack. We lived in a 4-plex on Ford Island near the battleship MARYLAND. My Dad had gone to work at the Radio Communications Building near the airfield. Mom and I were sleeping. When the attack began, we were awakened and she yelled to a neighbor to see what was going on. My only memory is standing in bed, my hands on the window sill and I am looking outside and seeing the whole world on fire and everything is in color.

My mother suffered "shell shock", what today we call PTSD, and couldn't stand low flying airplanes or watching war movies on tv. That morning when she ran for safety with me, she grabbed two bottles of milk and a blanket. Because she was right-handed, she probably carried me down the stairs to the basement in her left arm. Japanese machine gun bullets came through the walls and windows. One bullet went through her night gown. We hid in a small concrete basement room that housed a huge water tank and water heating units for the quarters above. It was a good place to go except the room had a window wall and the bullets came in and ricocheted around, burning her chest and arm. We were found by a search party at about 1500 and taken to the Bachelor Officers Quarters. A 500-pound bomb was found between our building and the building next to us. Had it exploded, Mom and I may not have survived.

My father was the Chief Radioman to Rear Admiral Patrick N. L. Bellinger, Commander, Patrol Wing 2, based at Ford Island. He often walked the quarter mile from our quarters to the Radio Building, but that day drove his Buick. The car was later found with many Japanese bullet holes. Dad and a young Navy pilot were inside the Radio Building awaiting the arrival of a flight of 12 Army B-17s from California. The Navy pilot was Lt. Kane, who Dad said later earned the nickname "Killer Kane" for his ability to shoot down Japanese planes.

Dad said he poured a cup of coffee just before 0755, but never got a drink all day long. There was an explosion at the end of the runaway, out of their sight. Lt. Kane phoned to dispatch Fire and Aid to what was thought to be a plane crash. A plane rose at a steep angle at the last second to go over their building. Lt. Kane said, "That's a Japanese plane. World War Two has now started." Dad said at that point in the war he only knew that the markings were strange. Dad sent the message, "This is no drill: We are being attacked by enemy forces." He said he later added the word "Japanese."

Within a few minutes the power had failed. Dad and Lt. Kane started a portable generator, but it ran only a short time and could not be restarted. While the generator was running, Dad was able to contact the Army bombers to warn them of the attack, but they had to continue to Hawaii because of low fuel. The bombers carried no ammunition, after all, it was peacetime, and they landed anywhere they could at different airfields, even on a golf course.

With no power for the radios, Dad walked out of the building and saw two "kids" who had yanked a .30 caliber machine gun out of a wrecked plane. Dad was the senior petty officer and was also an "old man" in Navy lingo because he had been in the Navy for 17 years. The gun needed ammunition, so Dad went to get it, but the keeper of the magazine would

not give it without a proper chit. Dad forcefully requested the ammunition and came back with several ammo belts for the gun. He said they fired at planes flying overhead. The Japanese pilots were looking for more important targets and didn't pay much attention to them. Dad told the gunner to stop for a few minutes as the barrel was getting too hot and changing color. The gunner resumed firing after the barrel cooled. Dad said he didn't think they hit any of the planes but trying gave them some little part in fighting back.

There was a break between the two main air attacks and they stood, stretched, and talked. The young sailor who was the gunner looked around and upon seeing that bullets had torn up the tarmac around them, said "Those guys were trying to kill me!" He fainted and fell to the ground. The war had suddenly become real to him.

Dad found Mom and me around midnight sleeping on a mattress in a hallway in the Bachelor Officer Quarters. What a joyful reunion that must have been to find we had all survived.

## NORFOLK NAVY BASE/NAUTICUS MUSEUM THURSDAY, JUNE 8, 2017

Tour the Norfolk Naval Base, the world's largest naval facility. Your guided bus tour will include: Admiral's Row, the Naval Air Station, and the piers. Enjoy a buffet lunch at one of the Clubs on base, featuring a salad bar and hot entree. After lunch, head downtown to Nauticus, an exciting 120,000 square-foot science and technology center that explores the power of the sea with interactive and On the second deck of educational exhibits.
